John L. Campbell (b. 1952) is the Class of 1925 Professor in the Department of Sociology at Dartmouth College. He is also Professor of Political Economy at the International Center for Business and Politics, Copenhagen Business School, and Adjunct Professor of Political Science at the University of Copenhagen. He has held positions previously at the University of Wisconsin, Washington State University, and Harvard University. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (sociology). His research interests include comparative political economy, globalization, and institutional theory. His previous work includes *Collapse of an Industry: Nuclear Power and the Contradictions of U.S. Policy* (Cornell University Press, 1988), *Governance of the American Economy* (Cambridge University Press, 1991), *Legacies of Change: Transformations of East European Political Economies* (Aldine Press, 1997), *The Rise of Neoliberalism and Institutional Analysis* (Princeton University Press, 2001), *Institutional Change and Globalization* (Princeton University Press, 2004), and *National Identity and the Varieties of Capitalism: The Danish Experience* (McGill-Queen's University Press, 2006).
