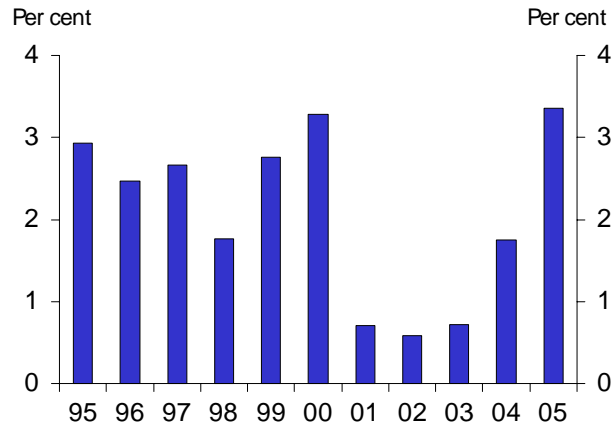

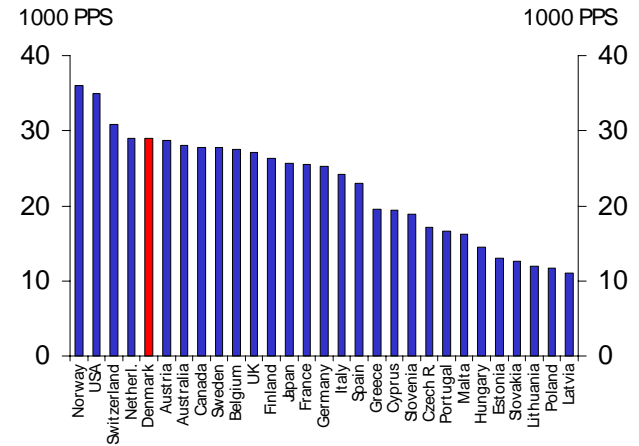
Danish real GDP growth

GDP per capita in 2005 Purchasing Power Standards (PPS)

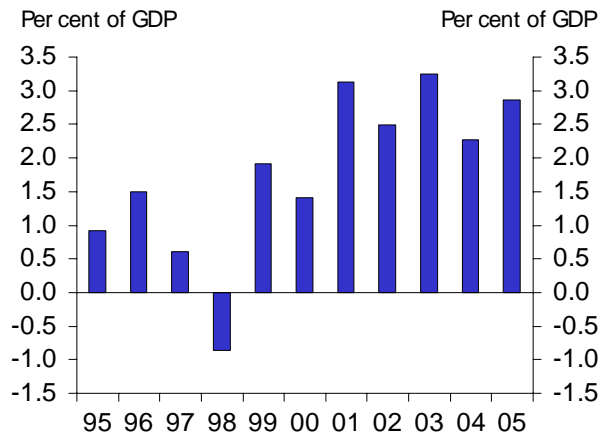

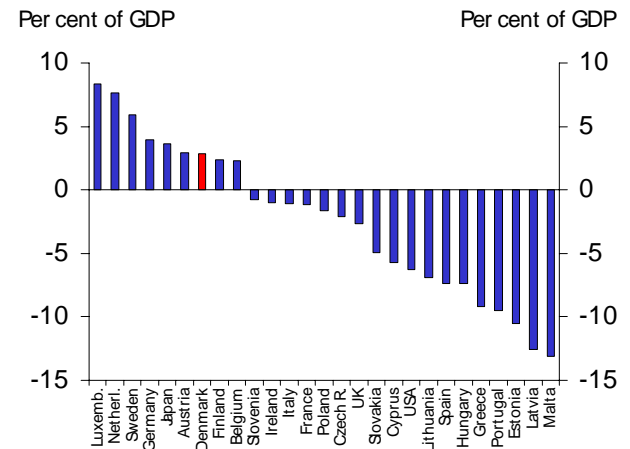
Danish current account

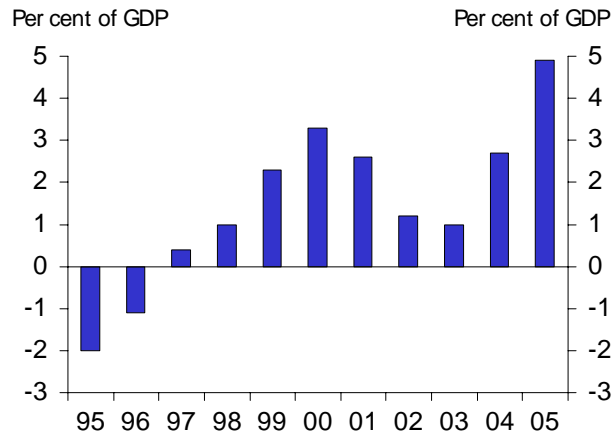
Current account, 2005

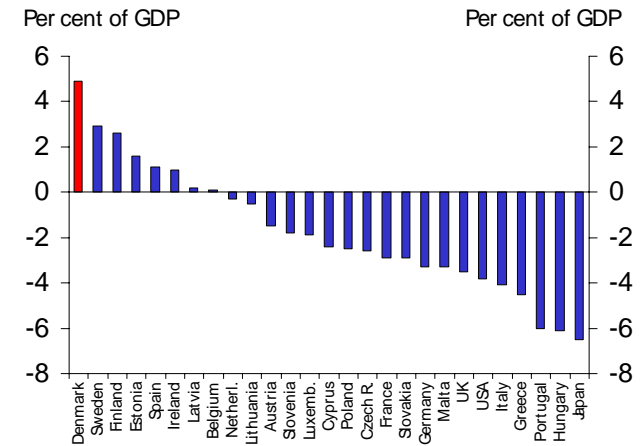
Danish public finances: general government balance

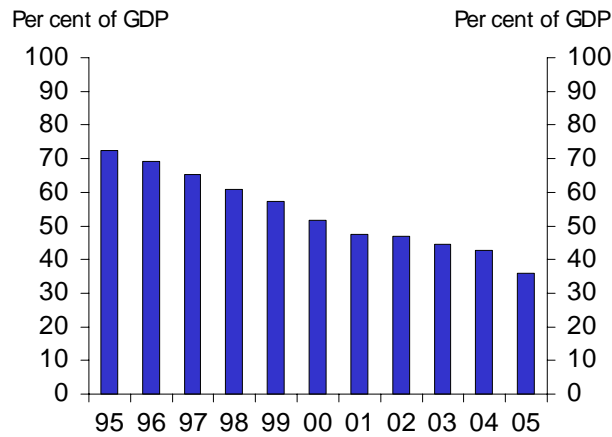
Public finances: general government balance, 2005

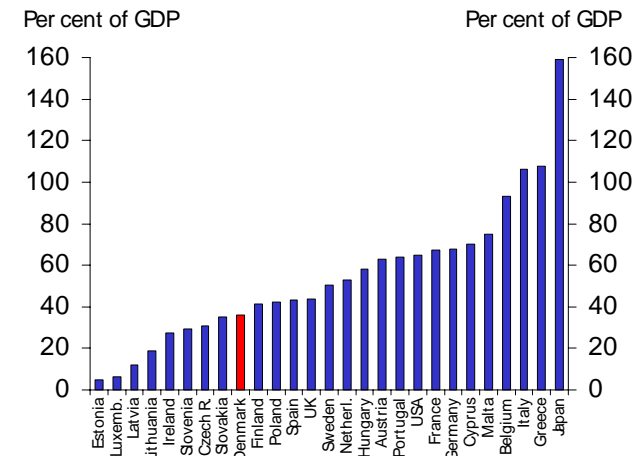
Danish public finances: general government gross debt

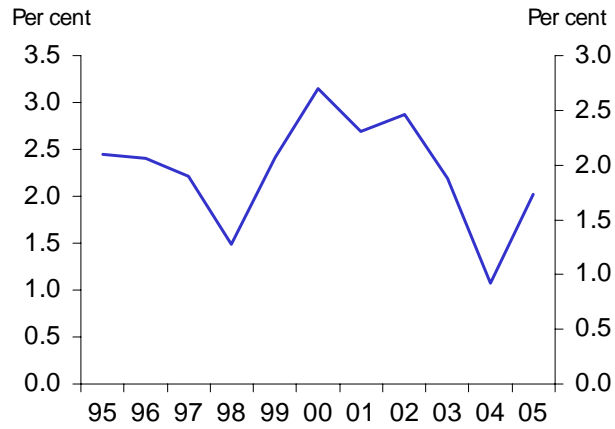
Public finances: general government gross debt, 2005

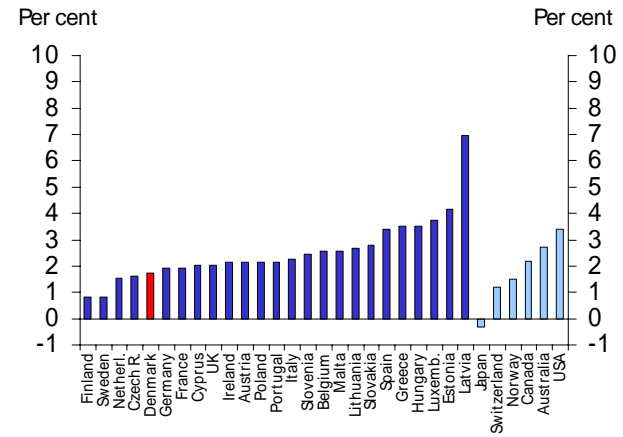
Danish consumer price inflation (HICP)

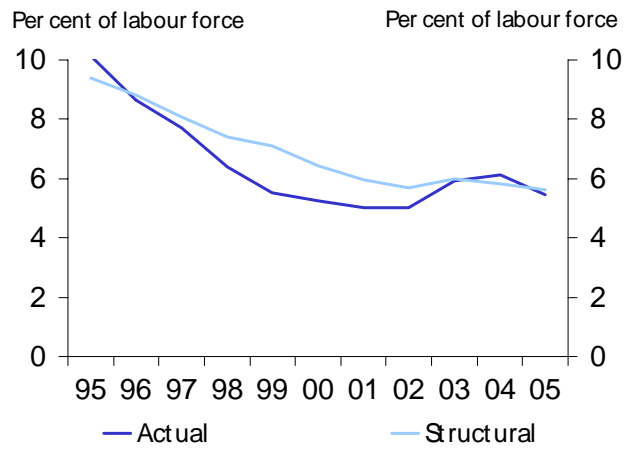
Consumer price inflation (HICP) in 2005

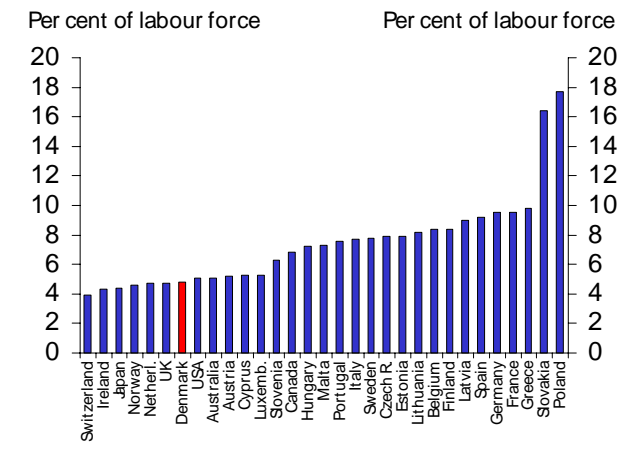
Danish actual and structural unemployment (national definition)

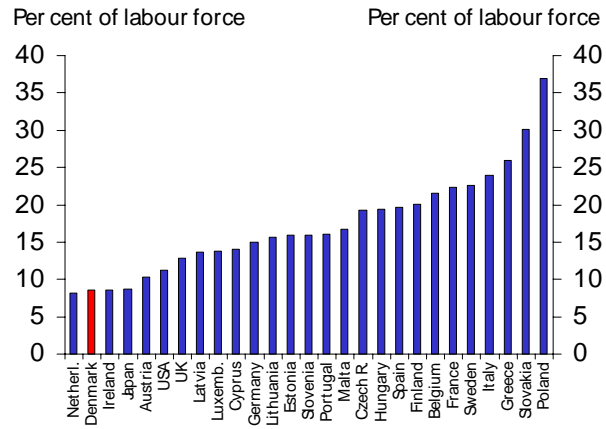
Harmonised unemployment, 2005

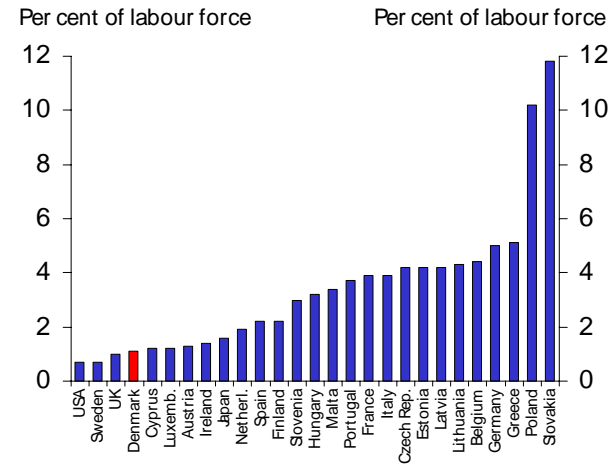
Harmonised youth unemployment, 2005

Harmonised long-term unemployment, 2005

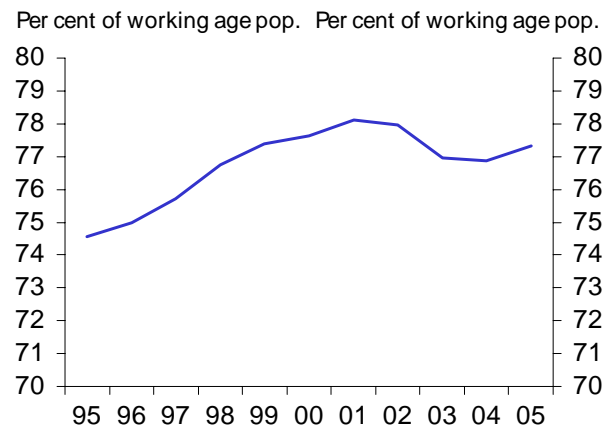

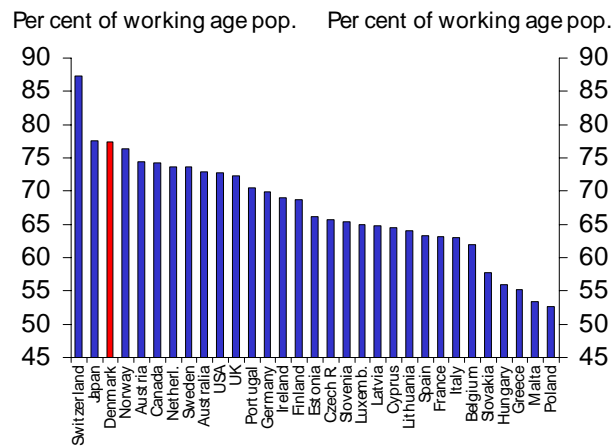
Danish employment
